ANNUAL SAVINGS*

SIMPLE, LOW-AND NO-COST CHANGES TO HELP YOU SAVE RIGHT AWAY:

\$85

Adjust water heater temperature

Adjusting your water heater temperature from 140 degrees to 120 can save you \$85 per year.

\$140

Use compact fluorescent light bulbs (CFLs)

Replacing just eight frequently used bulbs with CFLs can save you \$140 per year.

\$145

Sign up for EnergyWiseSM

Participate in Progress Energy's EnergyWise program, and you could save more than \$145 on your energy bill.

Depending on the program selected, participants must have centrally ducted heating and cooling, and electric water heating. Credits are issued when total electric usage is 600 kWh or higher and are prorated according to usage above 600 kWh.

Adjust your thermostat

Set your thermostat for savings: 78 degrees in the summer and 68-70 in the winter.

Upgrade attic insulation

If your home's attic insulation has an R-value of R-11 or less, upgrade it to R-30. You could also qualify for a rebate up to \$100.

Purchase Energy Star appliances

A 10-year-old refrigerator could cost you \$182 per year, while an Energy Star model costs only \$68 per year.

\$160

Install energy-efficient windows

Install energy-efficient double-paned windows to boost comfort and savings. You can even get a rebate up to \$250 to help you upgrade.

\$235

Choose an energy-efficient heat pump

Choose a heat pump with a SEER 15 rating to save roughly \$235 per year and qualify for a rebate up to \$350.

\$280

Fix leaky ducts

Leaky ducts waste up to one-third of heating and cooling costs. Schedule a **Duct Check** and you can get a rebate of \$150 toward their repair.

\$280

Install reflective roof

Replace your heat-absorbing dark roof with an Energy Star reflective roof to save energy and qualify for a rebate up to \$150.
